Sunday, October 1, 2023 - A Morning Tea Party!




We are breaking out our finest china and the cloth tablecloths for this auspicious event. We have our teapots ready for YOU!

Please mark your calendars for an important community event – the Oak Ridge Disabilities Fair – on Saturday, October 7 from 11 AM – 3 PM at the Oak Ridge Civic Center and Senior Center.

This is sponsored by the Oak Ridge Disability Advisory Board and is being supported by the Oak Ridge Ministerial Association and other organizations. The goal of the event is to foster relationships with those in our community who have disabilities and eliminate the stigma and fear that people feel about having disabilities.

I'm inviting the Parish to support this event through two ways:


- First, *just show up*! Those who attend can bring back some of what they have learned to bring greater awareness within our congregation.
- Second, we will need some volunteers who would be interested in helping put together 50 sandwiches for the boxed lunches that day. We need help with purchasing, preparing, and delivering the sandwiches by 10:30 that morning. Please reach out to me if you can help out.

The activities planned for that day are "extraordinary."

- Ten different speakers, along with ASL translators, will discuss a variety of topics, such as disability etiquette, how talk to people with disabilities, and a Q & A session with people who have a variety of disabilities answering audience questions.
- 50 vendors will be located in the Civic Center gym, offering information on housing, education, employment, transportation, etc.
- There will be demonstrations such as wheelchair basketball, young children with disabilities dancing, adaptive sports equipment such as grit wheelchairs for hiking.
- Discussions rooms will be open to the public for topics related to Seniors, such as aging in place, independent living, home modifications and tools for independent living.
- Local artists will be holding a show which recognizes and lifts up those with disabilities.
- Weather permitting, there will be a large tent set up in the Civic Center park with live music from five different groups.

Each year on October 4, The Episcopal Church celebrates the feast day of St. Francis of Assisi. An Italian friar and beloved saint, he is one of the most venerated individuals in Christian history. He is widely known for his love of nature and animals.

Please bring your pet in an appropriate carrier and/or a leash.

In case of inclement weather, the blessing of the animals will be postponed, and the service will be held in the Nave.

Most high, almighty Lord - Be praised for giving us the animals, birds and fish which fill your world. May we think of you and thank you when we play with and care for our pets. Be praised for making us so happy to have our pets and to have them to play with. We ask you, Lord, that we may be good to our pets always, so that they may be happy also. Help us always to take care of them so that they will be healthy. This we ask to your eternal praise, and to our blessing. Amen.

Lay Pastoral Caregiving Program Coming This Fall



Bear one another's burdens, and so fulfill the law of Christ. Gal. 6:2 (RSV)

St. Stephen's Clergy and the Pastoral Care Committee **are excited to announce** a new lay pastoral caregiving program beginning this fall, which we are terming "Companioning." The goal of the program is to equip parishioners to serve as supportive partners to persons going through difficult life challenges.

Those who complete the program will become Companions who will work to provide a "safe place," so that persons who are hurting can find a comfortable and caring listening presence. This program will complement the activities of St. Stephen's current caregiving programs, such as the Eucharistic Visitors, the Daughters of the King, and the Meals Ministry.

St. Stephen's implemented a similar program in the early 2000s, known as the Stephen Ministry. This will be a less intensive training program (15 hr vs. 50 hr; think "Stephen Ministry Lite").

Those parishioners who may want to join this program include: (1) those who feel called to this type of Companion ministry; (2) those who are already part of our ongoing parish caregiving programs and want to develop their skills; and (3) those who desire to learn the lay pastoral skills of listening and communicating caring, so as to add to their own discipleship.

We are planning to start this program in October 2023. Look for more details and sign-up information in next week's e-newsletter.
