## This Sunday - Feast of the Kings



This Sunday after the 10:00 service, we will celebrate the Feast of the Kings with the three types of cakes! Please join us as we begin the season of Epiphany. The Feast of the Kings, also known as Twelfth Night or Epiphany, is celebrated on January 6th. It commemorates the arrival of the three kings, who came to pay their respects to the Baby Jesus in Bethlehem.

In 14th Century France, the tradition of baking a special cake—a Gallette des Rois—stuffed with a bean or token came into being. Whoever found the token was crowned the King/Queen for the day. (It is interesting to note that the Gallette that is baked for the Presidential Palace has **no** token, to avoid the possibility of the President being crowned King!)

The French settlers brought this tradition with them to New Orleans, but the shape of the Kings' Cake evolved to a ring, symbolizing a crown. Over time, this tradition journeyed from France to Spain and eventually found a cherished place in Mexican culture as well, in the form of a Rosca de Reyes.
