## **CARE MINISTRY BEGINS THIS MONTH!**

On **December 13, 2020**, at the Sunday morning worship services, we will celebrate the beginning of a new parish-wide ministry. The goal of CARE – which stands for **Connecting** 

And REconnecting –is to ensure that each person at St. Stephen's knows they are remembered and valued. A team of 25 trained CARE callers will each be contacting a number of parish families and individuals every month, simply to "check in." CARE calls will complement Bailey's ministry by helping identify situations where more parish help might be welcome. CARE phone calls will also help identify opportunities to celebrate joyous occasions, or just be times to talk and get to know some of our fellow parishioners a little better.



Each parish family will receive a letter this week that provides more information about CARE. ## AN UPDATE ON COVID-19

With COVID numbers shooting up in our region, not to mention a number of parishioners at St. Stephen's who have been affected, we will continue to stream our indoor service and meet outdoors for in-person worship as long as we are able. We have purchased three large propane heaters to help provide some warmth on these cold Sunday mornings!

It pains me that we still cannot worship inside, but it is simply not practical right now.

My philosophy remains that we don't return to indoor worship until I am reasonably certain that we can start it without stopping it due to another spike in COVID cases. Rest assured, it is a priority for me to resume "regular" worship as soon as practically feasible.

In the meantime, please note our Christmas schedule on the next page. We will plan on having inperson worship Christmas Eve, weather and COVID permitting. We will also livestream one of these services. Our other services will be pre-recorded.



Please note that Blue Christmas, which has become a very meaningful and special service for so many, will not take place in large part because a great deal of the power of that service is in gathering together. We will be reaching out to a number of people in our congregation and community during this holiday season who might normally attend this service to let them know that the church is praying for them. Please don't hesitate to let me know if you know of someone to whom we need to reach out during this season.

In spite of the continued difficulties with COVID, we want to offer each of you a special Advent and Christmas season. In addition to the services, please check out this month's edition of the Evangel, which shares a tremendous number of resources for these upcoming liturgical seasons.
