Bailey will guide us through five of these strange stories. They won't try to explain or rationalize the stories. They will touch on these stories in their own context as well as in the wider perspective that the Bible speaks the living Word of God - a Word which cannot be easily tamed or understood. Indeed, mystery can and should be an integral part of our faith.

On October 29th, Parish Life is partnering with the Liturgics Team as we hold our first Boo-Charist. This family friendly service encourages costumes for young and old!



# New Lay Pastoral Caregiving Program Coming in January 2024

In January, St. Stephen's Clergy and the Pastoral Care Committee will begin a new lay pastoral caregiving program (postponed from this Fall due to scheduling challenges).

The goal of the program, which we have named "Companioning," is to *equip* parishioners to serve as supportive partners to persons going through difficult life challenges. The role of Companions will be to provide a "safe place," where persons who are hurting can find a comfortable and caring listening presence. In doing so the program will complement the activities of ongoing caregiving programs, such as the Eucharist Visitors, the Daughters of the King, and the Meals Ministry.

The Companioning program will involve a training program of 6 weekly sessions of 2.25 hours each. Participants may include: (1) persons who already think that they will want to participate in this new role; (2) persons currently involved in other ongoing parish caregiving programs, who want to improve their skills in what they already do; and (3) persons who simply want to enhance their own skills of listening and communicating caring.
