# Message from Fr. Bailey

St. Stephen's friends - We are blessed to be a growing and vibrant parish community that has a wonderful future ahead of it. I want to emphasize that your pledge is highly important. However, we have to begin looking at renewed ways of funding - particularly how we fund the ministries of St. Stephen's.

So, moving forward - I think most of you may not know this: we rely on pledge income for most of our funding (at least over 90%). It's why we have our annual pledge drive. However, Episcopal churches in our diocese - and in other denominations for that matter- are all facing the same reality: **that giving by pledging is going down across the board**. The way forward is for all of us to look at how we can diversify our funding. Your Finance committee is working on fundraisers to augment the budget. The committee is also looking at ways in which we can shape the budget to fit the current ministry needs of St. Stephen's.

One other thing you will hear about with the new year is planned giving. That activity is one that none of us want to do, but we all have to plan for the end of life. When we talk about disposition of our material wealth, please consider a gift to St. Stephen's. If you are retired and receive a required distribution, consider giving a portion of that as a gift to St. Stephen's. Know that it is tax deductible (of course talk to your accountant about that).

Thank you for all that you do - thank you for your presence here – and thank you for contributing to God's work in this community, in Oak Ridge, and in the wider world – because of your love of the Lord.

# **Outreach Spotlight**

### This November, Think Blankets!

Assuredly, I say to you, inasmuch as you did it to one of the least of these My brethren, you did it to Me. - Matthew 25:40 (KJV)

Our special Outreach project for November 2023 is the Blankets+ Campaign, conducted by Church Women United for Church World Service (CWS). For over 75 years, this program has provided blankets to families and individuals suffering from disaster and displacement in the U.S. and throughout the world. Current events are making the program more vital than ever, as blankets are

invaluable. They can be used as warm bedding, cloaks, totes to carry belongings, overhead shelter, privacy curtains, and even floor coverings. This program also provides tools for recipients to earn a living. Charity Navigator gives CWS the highest possible rating as a nonprofit.

Parishioners at St. Stephen's and other Oak Ridge churches have supported the Blankets program for many years. It takes only \$10 to buy a large and durable blanket which is specially made to be suitable for the recipients' climate. Our Outreach Committee is setting aside \$300 for the project, and we invite you to help us increase this contribution.

Starting the second Sunday in November, the loose offering will be dedicated to the Blankets+ campaign.
