A MESSAGE FROM FR. BAILEY

Friends –

I am beyond delighted and grateful to accept the call to serve as your next Priest-in-Charge! There are many of you that are new to St. Stephen's since I served as the Assistant from 2006-2009, and I am looking forward to meeting all of you and reconnecting with those we knew from our time before. St. Stephen's and Oak Ridge are home for us in that my wife Sara grew up as a child of your parish, her parents (Barbara and Richard Neill) are active members, and it was the place from which I was both married and ordained a priest. We still have many friends in the greater community and always savor our time back in the hills of East Tennessee.

Despite our great joy in returning to familiar and sacred ground, we are not back at St. Stephen's for a homecoming. And pledges for 2020 show a 10% increase over last year, about half of the increase from new pledges. Thus, we were able to adopt a budget with a small increase for lay staff, their first increase in several years. We still have financial challenges ahead, but are moving in a good direction.
