## NURSERY VOLUNTEERS NEEDED



## LIFE IN SCRIPTURE

"Are we there yet?" How many times have we said or heard this on a long road trip? This question is *really* old. Case in point: Numbers 2:10-18.

*At the Lord's command, Moses recorded the stages in their journey. This is their journey by stages:*

*They left Elim and camped by the Red Sea.*

*They left the Red Sea and camped by the Desert of Sin.*

*They left the Desert of Sin and camped at Dophkah.*

*They left Dophkah and camped at Alush.*

*They left Alush and camped at Rephidim, where there was no water for the people to drink.*

*They left Rephidim and camped in the Desert of Sinai.*

*They left the Desert of Sinai and camped at Kibroth Hattaavah.*

*They left Kibroth Hattaavah and camped at Hazeroth.*

*They left Hazeroth and camped at Rithmah.*

*(Note: These verses are followed by 27 more mind-numbing verses of leaving and camping locations. Count them up, and you'll find 42 different campsite locations for the Israelites!)*

Ultimately, the cliché rings true: life is a journey, composed of many stages. My son will frequently say, "I can't wait until I'm older to [fill in the blank]!", to which I always say, "Don't wish away your youth." But it's human nature: when we finish one thing, we are immediately on to the next. True confessions: I do it all the time with my knitting! Granted, skills learned or aquired help us on the next stage or project, but it's important to stop once in a while and appreciate the beauty in exactly where you are, in whatever stage you find yourself.
