
SUNDAY WORSHIP

STEWARDSHIP VIEWPOINTS: ADAM BALLINTOY

When I sit down to write about something, one of the first things I like to do is look up the definition of what I'm writing about. I found the best definition of stewardship in An Episcopal Dictionary of the Church, which says stewardship is "**our personal response to God's generosity in the way we share our resources of time, talent, and money.**" I used to think stewardship was only about money and how much of it we could give weekly, monthly, or annually to the church. But during my time at St. Stephen's my personal idea of stewardship has broadened to be more in line with the above definition.

By now, we've heard from several people, and we will continue to hear from several more over the coming weeks about this season of giving and the different ways our offering of time, talent, and money propels the ministry of St. Stephen's forward. One of the beautiful things about our community of faith is that our ministry is supported by the whole community.

We give our time and talents through the ministries, committees, and groups we volunteer with weekly or monthly. There are countless opportunities for service and some require more of our time than others. Volunteering our time isn't about being the most committed (and probably the most stressed), but about finding something that sparks joy each time you serve. Opportunities for service include joining the AV team and streaming our worship one Sunday each month, being a greeter and meeting people outside before service on Sunday, singing in the parish choir. 
