## LENTEN SOUP SUPPERS

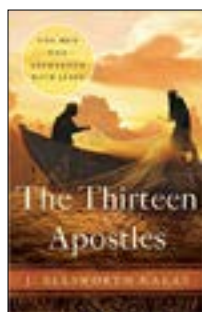
