RETURN OF THE CHALICE

Beginning this **Sunday July 4, 2021,** we will once again be serving wine at communion! But, since we are not quite ready for everyone to drink out of the chalice, we will have a special method for administering it.



The method will be **Priest's Intinction**: Fr. Bailey (or the presider) will intinct (i.e., dip) the wafer into the wine and then place it in your hands. A Eucharistic Minister, or Chalice Bearer, will be holding the cup. The priest will be the only one who touches the wafer and the lip of the chalice during communion.

If you wish to receive wine. Fr. Bailey will quietly ask you if you would like to receive it. If you indicate yes, he will dip the wafer into the wine and place it in your hands. If not, he will simply administer a "dry" wafer to you. **PLEASE**, do not ask him to place the host in your mouth at this time. Simply receive in your hands.

Remember that accepting in one kind (i.e., bread/wafer only) is still considered fully receiving communion. It is absolutely your choice whether you wish to receive the wine or not.
