




A READING FROM THE ACTS OF THE APOSTLES

ACTS 16:9-15

During the night Paul had a vision: there stood a man of Macedonia pleading with him and saying, "Come over to Macedonia and help us." When he had seen the vision, we immediately tried to cross over to Macedonia, being convinced that God had called us to proclaim the good news to them. We set sail from Troas and took a straight course to Samothrace, the following day to Neapolis, and from there to Philippi, which is a leading city of the district of Macedonia and a Roman colony. We remained in this city for some days. On the sabbath day we went outside the gate by the river, where we supposed there was a place of prayer; and we sat down and spoke to the women who had gathered there. A certain woman named Lydia, a worshiper of God, was listening to us; she was from the city of Thyatira and a dealer in purple cloth. The Lord opened her heart to listen eagerly to what was said by Paul. When she and her household were baptized, she urged us, saying, "If you have judged me to be faithful to the Lord, come and stay at my home." And she prevailed upon us.

REVELATION 21:10,22-22:5

In the spirit he carried me away to a great, high mountain and showed me the holy city Jerusalem coming down out of heaven from God. I saw no temple in the city, for its temple is the Lord God the Almighty and the Lamb. And the city has no need of sun or moon to shine on it, for the glory of God is its light, and its lamp is the Lamb. The nations will walk by its light, and the kings of the earth will bring their glory into it. Its gates will never be shut by day—and there will be no night there. People will bring into it the glory and the honor of the nations. But nothing unclean will enter it, nor anyone who practices abomination or falsehood, but only those who are written in the Lamb's book of life.

On either side of the river is the tree of life with its twelve kinds of fruit, producing its fruit each month; and the leaves of the tree are for the healing of the nations. Nothing accursed will be found there any more. But the throne of God and of the Lamb will be in it, and his servants will worship him; they will see his face, and his name will be on their foreheads. And there will be no more night; they need no light of lamp or sun, for the Lord God will be their light, and they will reign forever and ever.

THE GOSPEL JOHN 14:23-29

THE SERMON Fr. BAILEY NORMAN



The people stand or kneel. Then the Presider continues.

We give thanks to you, O God, for the goodness and love which you have made known to us in creation; in the calling of Israel to be your people; in your Word spoken through the prophets; and above all in the Word made flesh, Jesus, your Son. For in these last days you sent him to be incarnate from the Virgin Mary, to be the Savior and Redeemer of the world. In him, you have delivered us from evil, and made us worthy to stand before you. In him, you have brought us out of error into truth, out of sin into righteousness, out of death into life.

At the following words concerning the bread, the Presider is to hold it, or to lay a hand upon it; and at the words concerning the cup, to hold or place a hand upon the cup and any other vessel containing wine to be consecrated.

On the night before he died for us, our Lord Jesus Christ took bread; and when he had given thanks to you, he broke it, and gave it to his disciples, and said, "Take, eat: This is my Body, which is given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me."





EXTERIOR WORK DAY PLANNED

JUNE 21

An exterior work day is planned for June 21, between 8 a.m. and noon. Items on the agenda include (but not limited to):

- Cleaning up brush on the Southeast corner of the Memorial Garden.
- Looking at and possibly trimming back dead branches on a tree near the front entrance.
- Cleaning up the perimeter of the playground; leaves and grass.
- Cleaning the steps between the playground and the parking lot.
- Clearing parking lot debris, trimming sidewalks, etc.
- Gutter cleaning.
- Address any open items inside the church left over from the May work day.

We make the joke around St. Stephen's that half of Oak Ridge has a key to our building. This joke, however, has become more serious over the last couple of years as we continue to have issues with items disappearing, lights being left on all over the building, and outside doors being left unlocked on a regular basis.

It is also part of our policy that anyone who is not current with their Safe Church Training from the diocese should not have a key to the building. This policy, which is also a diocesan policy, is a protective measure to make sure that anyone who has access to the building has the information and knowledge to be aware of appropriate boundaries and interactions within the building and their responsibility to report anything that is suspicious. While not at St. Stephen's, there have been recent incidents at other churches in our area where inappropriate activity has taken place due to people having unlimited access to spaces who were not authorized to have it.

In discussion with your Wardens (Leah Bailey and Ben Shassere) and our Safe Church Coordinator (Judith Delaney), we have made the decision to begin enforcing this rule. In other words, if you are not current on your Safe Church training, please know that we will contact you to ask for your key until you have successfully completed or updated your training. Please understand that this is not a punitive measure. Rather, our commitment to being a safe space has to align with the policies that we have which allow us to make sure everyone with a key has an understanding of the responsibility that comes with that privilege.

We will have an in-person Safe Church training here again at St. Stephen's on June 22 following the 10:30 service. In addition, you are welcome at any time of year to sign up to take the training online. Either will get you covered. The training must be updated every 3 years according to diocesan policies. The training does take 3-4 hours, but it is a crucial piece of the responsibility we ALL have to make sure appropriate boundaries and behavior are always the norm here at St. Stephen's. INTERESTED IN GAINING MORE TOOLS TO HELP WITH YOUR FINANCES?

PLEASE SIGN UP FOR ONE OR BOTH OF THE UPCOMING FINANCIAL PLANNING WORKSHOPS!

For the month of June, St. Stephen's will be hosting two seminars to help our parishioners (and any guests you may want to bring) gain more tools on how to effectively manage and plan their financial resources. While we don't like to talk about money, the Scriptures do speak of money frequently. Jesus recognizes it is one of our greatest worries - and hindrances - in our relationship with God and with each other. One of the most common burdens people in any given church face is the stress of money - not having enough, not knowing enough to manage it, not knowing what to do with it after we die.

You are invited to attend either or both of the seminars listed below. The first one on June 1 is geared more towards planned giving during and at the end of life. The second one on June 29 is about learning strategies to manage our money for both present and future needs. Each will take place in the parish hall following the 10:30 a.m. service (starting at noon). **Lunch will be provided.**



We ask that, both for food planning and for our presenter, that you sign up ahead of time either by calling the office or by accessing the form on our website. (The QR code to will take you there.) Our presenter is Joe Ottaviano, CFP, CKA, a well-respected financial planner in Knoxville (his bio is also listed below).
