## **PLANT WATERING MINISTRY OPPORTUNITY**

There is an Oak Ridger known to several members of St. Stephen's, who has mowed lawns, dog-sat, cat-sat, and peoplesat for many of us for many years. She has also cared for the helpless or abandoned four-legged and two-legged of God's creatures all her life. It's our turn to help her.

She recently broke her left leg and left wrist. She has partial mobility with a walker but she cannot get in or out of her house without assistance. She has a very large collection of potted plants which are all outdoors and which need watering when the weather does not provide rain. We need one or more persons who could water the plants and one person who could coordinate all the waterers. She estimates that it would take 20 minutes to do the watering. The plants have a lot of shade, and can can go two days or so without rain before they need manual watering. And, of course, this is a **limited time task** because in a few weeks she will be back on her feet and doing

#### East Tennessee Reads <u>March</u> by John Lewis

Communities across East Tennessee are reading <u>March</u> by John Lewis during the summer of 2021. The <u>March</u> trilogy is an autobiographical black and white graphic novel trilogy about the Civil rights movement, told through the perspective of civil rights leader and U.S. Congressman John Lewis. The series is written by Lewis and Andrew Aydin, and illustrated and lettered by Nate Powell. In partnership with the East Tennessee Freedom Schools, our Episcopal Schools, and our parishes, the Diocese of East Tennessee is offering many ways to engage with the trilogy through interviews, discussion groups, reading camps, and even Godly Play stories. This offering is a joint partnership of the Diocesan Task Force on Becoming a Beloved Community, the Diocesan Task Force on Christian Formation, and the East Tennessee Freedom Schools.

At the end of the summer or early fall, participants will have the option to make a trip to Selma and share another aspect of this journey together. Between now and the end of summer, let's learn together!

- Disco Ball or colored lights to create a fun atmosphere


