Lent Begins



This season called Lent is an opportunity to work on healing and restoring relationships of all sorts. Lent began as a time of solidarity with those who were preparing for baptism at Easter. It marks the beginning of a special relationship with new members of the body of Christ. Lent is a time in which we are invited to recommit to the deepening of our relationship with Almighty God and grow in our interior life of prayer. Lectio Divina (holy reading) is an ancient practice from the Christian tradition which can aid us in the Lenten aim of listening more deeply to God, through the slow and intentional reading of Holy Scripture. Because for us the Scriptures are not dead words simply telling us of things that happened in the past, but livings words through which God still speaks to us. As St. Cyprian of Carthage said, "When you pray, you speak with God; when you read, God speaks to you."
