This Sunday - The Transfiguration

This Sunday we celebrate the Transfiguration, which is the feast which commemorates the time that Jesus revealed His divine nature to His three closest disciples - Peter, James, and John - on a high mountain.

August 6th was chosen as it is the date of the dedication of the first church built on Mount Tabor, which is traditionally considered to be the "high mountain" of the Transfiguration. It is observed as a "red letter day" in the Book of Common Prayer.
