All funds will be split and used to support the ministries of Grace Point, the Family Resource Center and the Blossom Center. This is a huge endeavor with lots of moving parts, and we need a wide variety of volunteers of all ages: publicity, set-up, cooking, serving, clean-up, payment, receipts, traffic control, etc!
