INCLEMENT WEATHER POLICY - From Fr. Bailey

As you all are aware, there is a forecast for snow accumulation beginning today. Due to the cold temperatures forecast throughout the weekend, snow and ice are likely to remain on the roads by the time we have church on Sunday.

Let me go ahead and state that all Christian Ed for children and adults is canceled for this Sunday. In addition, we will cancel the Celtic service which is scheduled for this Sunday as well. I am working on rescheduling the Celtic service for another Sunday this month, so for those of you who look forward to this service, it will happen - just not this weekend.

As far as services go, my policy for hosting church in inclement weather is that, if it is safe for me to come in, I will be here to have church. However, whether or not we cancel services on Sunday morning, please use YOUR best judgment as to whether or not it is safe for you to come to church. Some of you live on less hilly areas in town; some of you have very treacherous roads you have to navigate. If in doubt at all, please remain at home. Your safety is the utmost concern.

If conditions are such that we need to cancel services, both an e-mail and a Facebook post will go out Sunday morning no later than 7 AM. If you do not see an e-mail, that means I will be here and, as such, we will have services for anyone who feels it is safe to come. Be prepared that we may not have a livestream since all of our AV ministers live on very hilly streets! The same applies to anyone who is scheduled to serve - do not try to come in if you feel it is too dangerous. In the event of cancellation, I will at the very least have a recorded posting of my sermon for this Sunday.

If you need - or you know of a parishioner who may need - any special assistance in preparation for the weather event, please call the church office and let us know.

Celtic Service This Sunday

This Sunday January 12th is our Sunday to host the Celtic Contemplative service at St. Stephen's. It begins at 5 PM. This service, done in partnership with First United Methodist, is a service that emphasizes silent, meditative music, and an

abounding emphasis upon the goodness of God's creation to help us worship in a way that is less formal than our "traditional" Sunday morning liturgy but equally as powerful. Please come and invite those who may be looking for a quiet space to reflect before God to come as well.

New Adult Ed - Instructed Eucharist Class To Begin THIS SUNDAY!

We will continue our wonderful Lectionary Study each Sunday! As an alternative, Fr. Bailey will be offering an extended Instructed Eucharist class beginning this Sunday at 9:30 in the chapel. What is an Instructed Eucharist? In years past, St. Stephen's has offered an "extended" Eucharist during regular service in which the priest pauses to teach and explain certain parts of the service and why we do things the way we do. In this class, we will take a piece of the Eucharist service each week, carry it out together, and then talk about the origins and meaning behind each part. Toward the end of the class (closer to Lent), we will host a Eucharist one evening with a dinner following that will emphasize what we have learned.

Some of you may be unfamiliar with Brysonn's Closet, located in the old Anderson's Hilltop Market at the corner of West Outer Drive and Illinois Avenue. In the back of the Brysonn's Closet Thrift Store is a small food bank that serves over 100 individuals a month from Anderson, Roane and Morgan Counties.

The folks who come to Brysonn's are some of the poorest of the poor. After meeting with a caring worker, essential food items as well as pet food (if needed) and hygiene/cleaning items are given to the family. Brysonn's Closet is a non-profit totally supported by donations. All donations will be used by several Outreach members to purchase food, hygiene items, pet food, and cleaning supplies. These will then be taken to the Brysonn's Closet Food Pantry for distribution. We hope you will support this wonderful ministry.
