### **Faure Requiem Palm Sunday @ 4pm**

The Parish Choir will present Gabriel Faure's Requiem on Palm Sunday (April 13<sup>th</sup>) at 4 PM. Faure was born in 1845, at a time when the Classical period had just ended. His life was rooted in the Romantic Period, but by the time of his death in 1924, Jazz and Modernism was in full swing. Faure's Requiem is one of his best-known large works, based on the Requiem Mass. It is composed in seven movements, for choir, organ, orchestra, with baritone and soprano solos. Additionally, the string ensemble will offer a presentation of Lyric for Strings by American composer George Walker, the first African American graduate of the Curtis Institute of Music. Walker went on to become the first Black recipient of a doctorate from the Eastman School of Music at the University of Rochester, New York in 1955 and a Pulitzer Prize winner. He died in 2018 at the age of 96. This six minute composition, originally titled Lament, is inspired by the famous Adagio for Strings by Samuel Barber, a classmate of Walker and is dedicated to Walker's grandmother, Melvina King. This offering by the Parish Choir is presented in memory of Judy DiGregorio through Music Memorial Fund donations.

### **Maundy Thursday Vigil Sign-Ups**

One of our most popular Holy Week traditions is the "sitting of hours", or the vigil we keep in front of the stripped and barren altar overnight following our Maundy Thursday service. Beginning at 9 PM, St. Stephen's parishioners are invited to sit for blocks of 1 hour in the nave in silence, prayer, reading, and/or contemplation. To know we have shifts covered, we ask that you sign up on the forms which will be available each of the next two Sundays (or in the office during the week).

Please know that we will have someone in the building during this whole time for security reasons as this is always a common question. For those who sign up, you will get further instructions about which door to come in.

### **Diocesan Carbon Net Neutral Initiative**

Did you know that our Diocese of East Tennessee has adopted the goal of being carbon net neutral by 2030? Per Google AI, carbon net neutral means: "balancing the carbon dioxide released into the atmosphere with actions that remove or offset an equivalent amount, essentially achieving a net zero carbon footprint." Carbon neutrality can be achieved through reducing emissions and/or investing in projects that remove or reduce carbon dioxide from the atmosphere.

The Diocese has established a Carbon Net Neutral Task Force to help focus efforts to accomplish this goal. The great news is that these efforts can also reduce utility bills and help us address our larger needs including replacement of HVAC systems.
